ORBIS is a charity that has developed an operating theatre on a plane. They fly this plane to developing countries with the help of volunteer pilots and volunteer doctors to perform life-changing and sight saving operations in countries that do not have the facilities or expertise to provide this healthcare.

As part of the team, Mohammed was responsible for assisting the medical team. His duties included taking photographs of patients to record their symptoms, organising the medicines, writing case studies about individual patients, helping the doctors to complete paperwork and looking after the young patients before and after surgery.
