# Grammar Objective of the Week: Forming questions with Who, Whose, Which and How

A good question can be explosive. Imagine the questions that inspired people such as Martin Luther King, Nelson Mandela or Malala Yousefzai. Why can't I vote? Why do I have to carry this pass book? Who will help me to change this unfair political system? Whose responsibility is it that I'm not allowed to go to school in safety because I'm a girl? Similarly, incredible scientific and technological advances must have started with ground-breaking questions. Can you think of some possible examples?

Sometimes, questions in the classroom can be equally challenging (and exciting). Sir, are teachers like the pigs in "Animal Farm"? But who invented racism? How did she write such a powerful speech? Why can't I choose where to sit? I think my own favourite question is Who decides? Can you think of a question that has stopped you in your tracks at some point and made you think differently?

Beneath the power of these questions lies the ability to formulate them accurately in the first place. This is why our focus this week is on forming questions using who, whose, which and how. The trickiest of these is perhaps the use of whose. Remember that we use whose to ask about the person that owns or is responsible for something. Whose shoes are these? Whose decision is it? Remember also that who's is a contracted form of who is. Who's coming to the party? Who's responsible for this?

Finally, I hope this has been an interesting read and good luck with formulating all of your challenging questions this week!


#### WA Half Price Book Fair:



Can Katniss Everdeen win the final fight against the Capitol? Find out in this thrilling final instalment!




Big Game, by Dan Smith: just £3.50!






