as it is our first language."

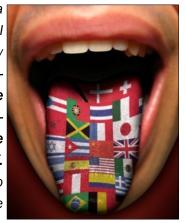
Heaven (Year 8), Esteban, Elliot and Matiss (Year 10)

How does bilingualism benefit you?

"If we spoke a different language, we would perceive a somewhat different world."

Did you know that more than half of the world's population is bilingual? That means about 3.5 billion people use more than one language to communicate every day.



There are commonly held benefits at-

tributed to the ability of using more than one language in our daily lives, such as **an increase in focus and the ability to multi-task.** Here are a few benefits we gathered that help explain the daily benefits of being able to speak multiple languages.

You can understand and appreciate cultural references and nuances. Most works of art and popular culture are more honestly represented in their native language. Listening to a song, reading a classic novel, watching a movie – these are expressions that bilinguals typically have the advantage of appreciating in their original form.

Bilingualism can create job opportunities and help you navigate the world. In addition, it's no secret that employers see language skills as a benefit for a prospective employee. There's one qualification that employers can't seem to get enough of, and that's fluency in a foreign language.

You feel a sense of connection with your heritage, history and family. For many, speaking another language keeps them connected to their families. Imagine not being able to communicate with your parents, grandparents, aunts and uncles simply because you don't share a common language. As the popular saying goes, "you can't know where you're going until you know where you've been"!

And also, your interactions with people of different cultures go deeper. When you speak someone's native language, you can talk about a lot more than the weather. Building deep and meaningful relationships with foreign communities usually involves speaking and understanding, partially at least, the same language. It's comforting when travelling to foreign countries and being able to speak their language — the locals appreciate it and make you feel more at home.
